July 2018



The 14th Annual Chief Atahm School Language Teaching Summer Institute is designed to bring together new and experienced First Nations Language Teachers. The summer courses are an opportunity to share our collective dreams of Language Revitalization by exploring theory and practice. The 2018 sessions will feature a 5-day TPR-Storytelling Course and a 5-day TPR-S and Advanced Language Teaching Techniques course. Both of these courses are accredited through Thompson Rivers University and through Nicola Valley Institute of Technology. Both courses are transferable to major institutions in BC.

The cost for each participant for each of the five day TPRS Summer Institute courses is \$800.00. This cost includes all instruction, handouts, and light lunches (soup & sandwich). There are limited spaces available for low cost billeting. There are motels, rv and camp sites, and other accommodations in the area.

TPR-Storytelling Course: Monday July 9th to Friday July 13th, 2018

The TPR-Storytelling methodology for second language teaching has been successfully implemented in language classrooms worldwide. This story-based teaching method employs Classic TPR, an action-based methodology that quickly develops a core communicative vocabulary, and progresses on to speaking using stories. Chief Atahm School has developed an intensive training program to help aboriginal language teachers build successful language programs through utilizing action-based, innovative teaching strategies. During this institute each participant will be provided with training through lectures, modeling, activities, and multimedia presentations to help develop skills specific to TPR-S. Dr. Kathryn Michel's, First Nations Language Essentials Level One (2018, FNSA/FNESC) will be used as the framework.

Advanced TPRS Techniques, Monday July 16th to Friday July 20th, 2018:

In this five day course, we will expand on the TPR Storytelling methodology and introduce learning to converse and read in the language. The focus will be on developing speaking skills and how literacy can support communication. This intensive course will provide many practical and theoretical experiences, including: lesson planning, creating yearly overviews, using technology and curriculum development. The First Nations Language Essentials Level Two draft will be used as a teaching framework.
